Santiago is the capital city and largest urban area of Chile, in addition to being the seventh largest city in Latin America in terms of population and one of the 45 largest metropolitan areas in the world.

Santiago is seat to the main agencies of government, finance, administration, commerce and culture in the country. Santiago is a city of great contrasts. There are many cultural, athletic and recreational activities at hand. It is in a privileged geographic location because in a bit more than one hour you can be skiing at one of the famous winter resorts or surfing on one of Chile's renowned beaches.

This city has an interesting range of activities for all tastes. The historic framework, found in downtown Santiago, provides a clear idea of how this city started. Many of the buildings have been maintained as historic heritage.

The Providencia sector is thriving with commerce and entertainment, a mix of stores, malls and restaurants for all types of visitors of all ages.



The UDD campus is located in the borough of Las Condes, particularly in the sector of San Carlos de Apoquindo. Santiago has a Mediterranean temperate climate. From autumn to winter (March to August) the annual average rainfall is 300 mm and the average temperatures are a low of 2°C and high of 15°C (39°F and 59°F). Spring and summer (September to March), on the other hand, are very hot, there is virtually no rain and the temperatures fluctuate from 17°C to 28°C (55°F to 82°F).
