

CALL FOR JOINT COURSE APPLICATIONS – FIRST SEMESTER 2018 (MARCH) INTERNATIONAL PROFESSORS

INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS OFFICE

The International Relations Office opens the application process for international professors (undergraduate and postgraduate teaching), from our <u>partner universities</u> to develop the **Joint Course Program**. This project requires co-designing a course to be taught during the first half of 2018 (March to July), in conjunction with a professor from Universidad del Desarrollo. The initiative must have the following components:

- International: All Joint Courses should generate learning in a global and multicultural environment, where students experience work and collaboration in international teams.
- Collaborative / Interactive: The course should be designed in a way where students from both institutions have at least 4 weeks of interaction between them.
- Project Design: The course should aim to develop a deliverable project, product of collaboration between both groups of students.
- Use of Technology: The course should be based on virtual technology communication tools, so students can interact (Skype, social networks, Slack, Google Hangouts, Blackboard, etc.)

The aim of the Joint Course Program is to promote and develop the global competencies of under and post-graduate students, so each course should consider the following objectives:

- 1. Develop the ability to work effectively in multicultural teams.
- Identify the difficulties and benefits of different environments (considering economic, social and cultural contexts).

- Apply project management and intercultural communication techniques to be able to achieve course objectives.
- Understand the differences and similarities which stem from cultural backgrounds in relation to the course topics.

Application Outcomes: August 25th, 2017

Beginning of the course: March 2018
