

## Relevant Information for International Students travelling to Chile during the Fall Semester 2021

Foreign students that are planning to participate in UDD's face to face programs during the Fall Semester 2021 (August-December) must take in consideration the following relevant information:

- It is possible that classes will be taught under a hybrid modality. Since 2019,
   UDD has implemented a hybrid system Hyflex classes which gives students the possibility to attend classes in person or virtually.
- The viability of the face to face exchange program will depend on the policies
  of the Chilean Government, leaving certain factors such as, border control
  and visa errands out of our control.

## **Relevant Information:**

1. While facing the Covid-19 pandemic the Chilean government has established a gradual strategy to face the pandemic according to the health situation of each particular region and/or neighborhood. There are <u>5 stages</u> which determine the level of mobility and commerce operation that range from strict restrictions (Phase 1: total quarantine) to more flexible mobility conditions and operations (Phase 5: advanced opening). They advance or retreat from one particular phase to another based on epidemiological indicators, health care networks and traceability.

Students must respect these measures, since these are part of public health policies in order to prevent the spread of the disease. Face to face classes viability will depend if the "Phase" allows the functioning of educational establishments (Universities, Schools, etc.).

2. Travel restrictions may vary in the months prior to the students exchange, so it is important to take this into consideration and check the <u>official information</u> before any flight and/or accommodation bookings.



- 3. All travelers entering Chile must follow the country's sanitary protocols that may include the following requirements:
- Comply with a mandatory 10-day quarantine, without the possibility of exempting or ending it early. The first 5 days are mandatory in a Transit Hotel for Travelers, which must be reserved before arrival.
- Complete the health passport that can be requested at <a href="https://www.c19.cl">www.c19.cl</a>
- Have a negative RT-PCR test up to 72 hours before boarding.
- Must enter the country with health insurance, contracted in their country of origin and that provides coverage for international medical care in the case of contracting COVID-19 in our country. This insurance must have a minimum coverage of USD \$ 30,000.
- Complete the follow-up form within 14 days of entering the country.
